From the Pastor, "Re-imagining Sabbath"

Some of you may have been hearing conversations about changes we could make for the year 2014. The Elders have been talking about it with me, and the council has discussed it as well. And now I want to start talking about it with everyone. After participating in a Disciple's sponsored webinar titled "5 Mistakes Churches Make When Visioning for the Future," I had the opportunity to ask the speaker about our church. I told him that as a new pastor, I had inherited a church that was visibly weary from years of fighting to survive. I asked him, "How does a church plan for the future when it is so tired from the recent past that it wilts at the mere mention of planning?" He said that there are many churches in our situation, and his recommendation to all of them has been to take a yearlong sabbatical from the Constitution, By-laws & programming and to focus entirely on prayer and bible study.

As I prayed about this and talked about the idea with the spiritual leaders of the congregation, a picture for what 2014 could look like began to evolve in my mind. I'm getting really excited about the church taking such a sabbatical and I hope that you will too. This is what I think 2014 could be like for us: For **one** year there would be no leadership retreat; no Council meetings (except for emergencies); no scheduled committee meetings (except for Partnership team); no pot luck meals; no VBS or Easter egg hunt; no special services; no Fellowship time signup; no food at Disciples Women; no food ministry; and no community Halloween party.

For **one** year we WOULD do the following: there would be a congregational commitment to coming to worship, to attending either Sunday School or Prayer Service (if not both), and to continued giving of tithes and offerings; I would host a series of prayer and Bible study meetings at my house each week for different groups (children, men, parents, youth/young adults, 60 & up, etc.); We would continue with one adult Sunday school class and one children's class; the 2013 officers, elders & deacons (might?) agree to serve in the same positions for one more year (with minimal responsibilities), and then we'd elect new leaders for 2015; elders, deacons and liturgists would serve in worship services as usual; we would provide aid to grieving families; the newsletter would contain Bible study aids, & prayer requests/concerns; we would continue with Worship & Wonder; we would have a simplified version of Fellowship Time; Holy Week would be a time for contemplation, prayer, and rest; we would spend a whole year focusing only on God.

Some of the concerns raised have a lot to do with the misconception that we would be taking a year off from church, thus possibly losing members and visitor interest. I want to reassure you that we would not be taking a year off from church, but instead taking a year off from "busyness for the sake of busyness" and focusing entirely on our Lord and Savior. Plus, there would be many opportunities to include our visitors in group building and spiritually uplifting activities without overwhelming them with any work or responsibilities.

Please begin praying about this groundbreaking idea and come ask me about any idea or concern that comes to mind. It will have to pass in a congregational vote for this to happen, so I want to make sure that every person fully understands what it means to 'RE-IMAGINE THE SABBATH!"
